How we use personal information on Get Information about Schools (GIAS)

Under data protection law, individuals have a right to be informed about how Northern Arch Learning Partnership uses any personal data that we hold about them. We comply with this right by providing 'privacy notices' (sometimes called 'fair processing notices') to individuals where we are processing their personal data.

This privacy notice explains how we collect, store and use personal data about our Academies' and Trust governance.

The categories of governance information that we process include:

- personal identifiers, contacts and characteristics (such as name, date of birth, contact details, address, and postcode)
- governance details (such as role, start and end dates and governor ID)
- Identification documents
- DBS numbers and other safeguarding relevant checks for individuals to carry out their role
- Information about business and pecuniary interests
- Relevant reference information and evidence of qualifications

Why we collect and use governance information

The personal data collected is essential, in order for the school, academy or academy trust to fulfil their official functions and meet legal requirements.

We collect and use governance information, for the following purposes:

- to meet the statutory duties placed upon us

Under the [UK General Data Protection Regulation \(GDPR\) 2018](#), the legal bases we rely on for processing personal information for general purposes are:

- for the purpose a) named above in accordance with the legal basis of legal obligation

All local authority maintained school governing bodies, under [section 538 of the Education Act 1996](#), and academy trusts, under the [academy trust handbook](#), have a legal duty to provide the governance information as detailed above.

Collecting Governance Information

We collect personal information via recruitment forms, data collection forms, and business interest declarations. All information is kept securely and used only as outlined above.

Governance data is essential for the school/academies' operational use. Whilst the majority of personal information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it may be requested on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with GDPR, we will inform you at the point of collection, whether you are required to provide certain information to us or if you have a choice in this.

Storing Governance Information

Sharing Governance Information

Who we share governance information with

We routinely share this information with:

- Multi-Academy Trust – to allow the business to function, such as sharing information with HR, audit and finance teams
- Suppliers and service providers – to enable them to provide the service we have contracted them for, such as governor/trustee support
- Police forces, courts, tribunals – to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with it, such as CCTV footage or contact information
- the Department for Education (DfE)
- Companies House

This list of organisations is not exhaustive and, where lawful and necessary, we may share personal data with other relevant bodies.

Why we share governance information

We do not share information about individuals in governance roles with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Department for Education (DfE)

Department for Education (DfE)

Requesting access to your personal data

The UK GDPR gives you certain rights about how your information is collected and used. To make a request for your personal information, contact sjones@nalp.org.uk

Your rights include:

- the right to be informed about the collection and use of your personal data – this is called 'right to be informed'.
- the right to ask us for copies of personal information we have about you – this is called 'right of access', this is also known as a subject access request (SAR), data subject access request or right of access request.
- the right to ask us to change any information you think is not accurate or complete – this is called 'right to rectification'.
- the right to ask us to delete your personal information – this is called 'right to erasure'.
- the right to ask us to stop using your information – this is called 'right to restriction of processing'.
- the 'right to object to processing' of your information, in certain circumstances.
- rights in relation to automated decision making and profiling.
- the right to withdraw consent at any time (where relevant).
- the right to complain to the Information Commissioner if you feel we have not used your information in the right way.

There are legitimate reasons why your information rights request may be refused. For example, some rights will not apply:

- right to erasure does not apply when the lawful basis for processing is legal obligation or public task.

- right to portability does not apply when the lawful basis for processing is legal obligation, vital interests, public task or legitimate interests.
- right to object does not apply when the lawful basis for processing is contract, legal obligation or vital interests. And if the lawful basis is consent, you don't have the right to object, but you have the right to withdraw consent.

If you have a concern about the way we are collecting or using your personal data, you should raise your concern with us in the first instance or directly to the Information Commissioner's Office at raise a concern with ICO

Withdrawal of consent and the right to lodge a complaint

How government uses your data

The governance data that we lawfully share with the Department for Education (DfE) via GIAS will:

- increase the transparency of governance arrangements
- enable local authority maintained schools, academies, academy trusts and the Department for Education (DfE) to identify more quickly and accurately individuals who are involved in governance and who govern in more than one context
- allow the Department for Education (DfE) to be able to uniquely identify an individual and in a small number of cases conduct checks to confirm their suitability for this important and influential role

Data collection requirements

Some of these personal data items are not publicly available and are encrypted within the GIAS system. Access is restricted to authorised Department for Education (DfE) and education establishment users with a Department for Education (DfE) Sign-in (DSI) account who need to see it in order to fulfil their official duties. The information is for internal purposes only and not shared beyond the Department for Education (DfE) unless the law allows it.

How to find out what personal information the Department for Education (DfE) hold about you

Under the terms of the [Data Protection Act 2018](#), you're entitled to ask the Department for Education (DfE):

- if they are processing your personal data
- for a description of the data they hold about you
- the reasons they're holding it and any recipient it may be disclosed to
- for a copy of your personal data and any details of its source
